



2012 Scholarship

Rules, Regulations, and Application Procedures

The UFCW Local 881 Charitable Foundation scholarship will be awarded to a member or child of a member in good standing with Local 881 UFCW in accordance with the provisions of Local 881 and UFCW by-laws. This means that the member must have been in **continuous good standing with all dues fully paid for one year**, with **membership commencing on or before April 30, 2011**. The member must also maintain membership in good standing until the time the award is presented in order to be eligible to receive a scholarship.

Four \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded in 2012; one each in Northern Illinois, Central Illinois, Southern Illinois, and Northwest Indiana. Winners are not eligible to receive more than one award. If a qualified applicant cannot be selected from any of the four regions, a scholarship will not be awarded for that region. One additional applicant, judged outstanding among all entries, will be chosen to receive a \$4,000 award. **NOTE: Previous Local 881 UFCW Scholarship winners are *not* eligible to apply for these awards.**

Applicants must be attending full-time, or accepted to attend full-time, an accredited college, university, community college, or recognized trade school at the time the award is presented. Applicants should complete and return the attached application and submit along with certain school documents. They will also be asked to write an essay, no longer than 1,200 words, on the labor topic listed on the application materials. ***Failure to fill out completely and legibly any portion of the application form, or to provide any of the requested documentation or other materials, will result in disqualification.*** All essays will remain the property of Local 881, and Local 881 retains the right to print any submitted essay in any of its publications or on its website. Local 881 also reserves the right to publicly use the names of the winners for promotion of its scholarship program.

Applicants will be selected based on academic achievement, career goals, leadership, and a demonstrated understanding of the American Labor Movement. Scholarship recipients will be selected by an independent panel of labor leaders, educators, civic leaders, and/or public officials and the decision of the Scholarship Selection Committee will be final. Award winners ***only*** will be notified by **April 15, 2012**, and will be invited and ***required*** to accept their awards at a Scholarship Awards Ceremony hosted by Local 881. Specific scholarship amounts will be announced to the winners prior to the award ceremony. Winners will also be required to provide the committee with official certification of acceptance, enrollment, or attendance at an accredited institution of higher learning prior to receiving their awards.

The deadline for submission of the application form is midnight, **February 29, 2012**.

Note: Applications postmarked after February 29, 2012, will not be accepted.

Failure to complete any part of the application will remove it from consideration.

The application form and all other requested materials must be postmarked by midnight, February 29, 2012.

Materials to include:

- Completed application form.
- Essay
- Applicant's complete official high school* and college (if applicable) transcripts; be sure GPA is included along with an explanation of how it is calculated (example: if your GPA is listed as 3.0, please document whether it is based on 4.0 or 5.0 scale)
*If applicant graduated from high school prior to 2007, a copy of his or her diploma can be submitted if transcripts are unavailable.

The decision of the Scholarship Selection Committee will be final and binding. Scholarship recipients *only* will be notified no later than April 15, 2012, and will be provided with all information necessary to obtain their awards at that time.

Essay Topic

On separate paper, please write an essay addressing the topic:

In a struggling economy, how do Unions play a role in lifting workers up? How have you benefited as a member of Local 881 (or a child of a Local 881 member)?

Please use your personal experience/viewpoint as well as research to back up your argument. Your essay should be typed, double-spaced, and should not exceed 1,200 words. The Scholarship Selection Committee will be looking for a demonstrated understanding of the American Labor Movement, description of personal experience, and evidence of some research of the topic as well as appropriate writing, grammar, and organizational skills.

NOTE: Handwritten essays will immediately disqualify your application.
